Validation Generally

Section 6(4) of Building Control Act 1990:

BCA shall **not** be under a duty to ensure

- Buildings /works relevant to certificates or commencement notices will comply with building regulations or be free from defect;
- Certificate complies with requirements;
- Facts stated in certificate are true and accurate.

N.B. Adhere to procedural requirements.

Validation at Commencement

Procedural matters-

- Is notice required?
- Notice only or notice plus compliance documentation and certification?
- BCMS records date. 7 day validation period (12 for paper-based applications)
- Principle of fairness additional information
- Don't confuse with other processes

Validation at Commencement

- Is notice filed electronically/set on (current) prescribed form?
- Is it signed by the owner?
- Is Compliance Documentation in order
 - General arrangement drawings
 - List of design documents (as prepared or to be prepared)
 - Outline statement of compliance approach
 - Proposed inspection plan

Validation at Commencement

- Are Certs/Notices/Undertakings in order:
 - Design Certificate (registered professional)
 - Assignment of Assigned Certifier (registered professional)
 - Undertaking of Assigned Certifier
 - Assignment of Builder (Self-builder, sole trader, Company Director or Principal, CIRI registration optional)
 - Undertaking by Builder

- Is Certificate in order?
- Plans, calculations, specifications and particulars for any amendments from those submitted at commencement
- Inspection Plan as implemented by assigned certifier

- Building Control Authority may reject the certificate and documentation or query within 21 days. 7 additional days on receipt of additional information.
- Typical checks documents received (not scrutinised), signatories – registered & assigned, enforcement notices, conditions on FSC / DACs, Bord Pleanala Conditions.

- 5-3 weeks notice facility
- Phased Developments
 - Works
 - Buildings
 - Areas within a building
 - Units/phases of Development/Buildings

NB Clarity of description on certificate important in context of statutory register.

- 5-3 weeks notice facility

NB Clarity of description on certificate important in context of statutory register.

Other Matters

- Copyright information Circular 1/2005
- Cert must be on register before works or building may be opened, occupied or used.
 - Currently applies in relation to FSC
 - Where safety concern exists consider options under Act of 1990.
